What is AMRG?

AMRG is a group of outdoor enthusiasts whose passion for the wilderness led them to ask, "If I got into trouble in the woods, who would come help me?" AMRGers decided that *they* would be the ones to help — and wanted to be the best they could at it.

AMRG is an all-volunteer search-and-rescue team that helps local and state authorities find people who are lost or in trouble in the woods; gain safe access to them, wherever they are; and get them out, whether they just need to go home, or to an ambulance. And AMRG does all that without charging a penny to the lost person, his or her loved ones, or the authorities.

Every AMRGer is first and foremost a ground search technician, able to function as a member of a search team in the field or an evacuation team carrying a patient out of the woods; but from there, members can choose from a number of SAR specialties, including:

- Field team leadership
- Dog handling
- Search management
- Rope rescue
- Snow and ice rescue
- Wilderness medical care
- Search theory/research

AMRGers benefit from membership in a number of ways. First, there's the satisfaction of doing an important job that makes a difference in people's lives. You also get to be a member of a team that enjoys a reputation for leadership in the local SAR community, and for being the best of the best.
