The Director of Training has the authority to accept or reject the recommendation or designate an option, such as additional training, teaching a class, etc. The Director of Training may delegate this authority to exempt from training to the Unit Training Officer.

Dues and Fees

It was the unanimous decision of the Board to set the following schedule of fees and dues:
