OLD BUSINESS:

AO CERTIFICATION:

Peter McCabe expressed dissatisfaction with the speed of progress on this issue. He first asked for MD AO training in FEB 92. Gary Mechtel was forced to act as an AO recently using the reasoning that he was once an AO when he was still with BRMRG and no one ever specified that he ceased to be one upon moving to SMRG. Peter charged that BRMRG was discriminating against his group by delaying AO training.

Camille Birmingham, the BRMRG Alert/Dispatch Coordinator, stated that she could not identify candidates for training amongst members of other groups in the same way that they were identified in BRMRG, as she does not know their individual capabilities as well. New written standards for identification of a candidate had to developed, based on what a MD AO would be expected to do, as opposed to a BRMRG AO. Those duties have only recently been defined, and BRMRG has now developed a proposed standard for identifying candidates and certifying them. Several members of BRMRG denied that they were attempting to prevent the development of MD AO's.

Bob Koester read this proposal to the Board, and a copy is attached. It was not distributed at the meeting due to lack of a photocopier. No further action was taken at this time.

It was pointed out that this process has not proceeded appreciably slower than most other projects which the Board has undertaken.

RADIO LICENSE:

SEE COMMO REPORT - As mentioned there, PA SAR Council has given us permission to use their radio license until ours is renewed. A motion passed to accept and sign the attached MOA with PA SAR Council concerning the use of their radio license.

Bob Koester suggested that we contact DES and Dogs East for permission to use their licenses and thereby expand the available frequencies. The responsibility to do so was assigned to the Communications Secretary.

Peter McCabe suggested we have a formal review of our renewal process and document some learning points. A motion passed to review at the next BOD meeting the circumstances of the expiration of the radio license. Gary Mechtel volunteered to provide this review. The new Commo Secretary (who is yet to be identified) was assigned the responsibility of developing guidelines for renewal of an existing license and acquisition of a new license.

TSAR 36-MONTH REVIEW:

TSAR presented a roster, list of equipment, mission list and financial statement. The Board determined that TSAR met the recertification requirements specified by the ASRC Ops Manual, and a motion passed to pass TSAR on its 36-month review and to recertify TSAR as a Certified Group of the ASRC.

MSAR 36-MONTH REVIEW:

MSAR requested an extension until June due to short notice concerning the review. A motion passed to extend the certification of MSAR until the June meeting of the ASRC BOD.

IS RECERTIFICATION:

Only one test has been returned and graded. There were several recommendations from those taking the test to remove the more frivolous questions to insure that the professional image of the ASRC is maintained with anyone outside the ASRC who may view the test.

Peter McCabe raised the issue that some IS have trouble reaching searches in time to receive the IS shifts they need to recertify, and suggested that IC's be encouraged to make room in the plans for these personnel. After some discussion, the Board took no action on this issue.

The status of Gene Harrison, according to the Conference Training Officer, is FTL, since AMRG never objected to him not being listed as IS during an official BOD inquiry some time ago. He had not, as of this meeting, replied to the Secretary's inquiry concerning his IS status. After some further discussion in which his lack of involvement in ASRC

missions was noted, a motion <u>passed</u> that Gene Harrison be listed as FTL on the Conference Roster. If he wishes he may defend his case for being IS, with documentation, at a future BOD meeting.

The following motion FAILED: A letter will be sent to all IS members, including a copy of the training standards. This letter will specify that all IS members <u>must</u> take the test and return it by 15 May 93, but that the test will not be binding and is for training purposes only. If a member does not currently meet the shift requirements for recertification, they will instead be required by this letter to have two such shifts before 31 DEC 93 in order to recertify. The Board felt that the current process should be given more time before such action is taken.

Votes were held by secret ballot and candidates (who were, by current definition of the bylaws, members of the Board) were allowed to vote. Discussion of the candidates was held after the candidates were asked to leave the room.

David Carter and Gary Mechtel were nominated for the position of Chair. David Carter was then reelected with 6 votes to one vote for Gary Mechtel and one abstention. Jenny Burmester and Bob Koester were nominated for the position of Vice-Chair. Jenny Burmester was elected with 6 votes to 2 votes for Bob Koester. The only nomination for Secretary was

Bob Koester. He accepted the position as an official figurehead solely to meet the requirement of the Bylaws that the Secretary be a member of the Board. It was made clear that Bob Koester would not be expected to carry out any of the Secretarial duties other than serving as Chair in the absence of both the Chair and the Vice-Chair, and that a Recording Secretary would be appointed for the purpose of carrying out all other Secretarial duties. Bob Koester was then declared Secretary. Camille Birmingham was the only nominee for Treasurer. She accepted the nomination and was declared Treasurer.

LICENSE UPDATE:

Everybody can breath a little easier now - the Pennsylvania SAR council has granted us temporary authorization to use their radio license - WHEW! As soon as I get the details from Peter McCabe (call sign, frequencies, terms, etc.) I will dispatch that info immediately to the conference.

At this point we have an FCC license application ready to go as well as checks in hand from Patrick Turner. I have contacted the FCC and NABOR (the original frequency coordinator) to ask if we can re-apply for our original frequencies without incurring any additional costs for frequency coordination. The FCC doesn't have a problem with it as long as NABOR is willing to give their seal of approval. I'm supposed to have an answer from NABOR by Monday, 5 April. If we can pull this off the only money we will have to spend will be the \$35 application fee to FCC. (After all, we are a dirt poor volunteer group operating on a shoe string.) Should NABOR refuse, I will immediately dispatch the application "as is".

As I mentioned earlier, once I get the details of our license agreement from Peter, I will send that info out with a letter updating everyone on where we're at with everything. In the mean time, don't use this stop - gap measure as an excuse not to get that business frequency programmed into your radios!

TRAINING REPORT TO THE APPALACHIAN SEARCH & RESCUE CONFERENCE

April 2, 1993

FTL Test

The appropriate answer to Question 100 has been mailed to GTOs.

Several questions have been raised re: appropriate answers to some FTL test questions. These are being collated at the moment. Questions will then be discussed with the test makers. This should be completed in about a month.

Lisa Hannon has agreed to work on two additional versions of the FTL test.

FTM Test Development

It was anticipated that in early March the 150 base line questions would be modified with editing into a beta version of 100 questions for mailing to all GTOs for their review and comment. The 150 question segment was previously mailed to the 3 groups that provided input for their comments: M/SAR, TSAR and SWVMRG. Plans called for the final cut of a beta version to be available by the ASRC annual meeting in April. At least three versions of the test are planned.

Unfortunately, no one has provided any input to the 150 base line questions.

It's difficult to work in a vacuum. Hopefully, some one will provide some input shortly so we can proceed in an orderly and timely manner.

Group Training Officer Status:

At the February 1993 meeting it was incorrectly reported that the TSAR GTO position was vacant. I received incomplete information from TSAR. Earl Evans remains the TSAR GTO.

ASRC Training Standards and Training Manual Information:

On July 28 all ASRC GTOs were asked to send a list of reference materials used in their group FTM training programs. It was emphasized that materials could be in any format, published or otherwise. The goal was to gather basic information on what each ASRC group uses to conduct its training.

- ✓ During November and December three Groups responded: AMRG, M/SAR and SWVMRG.
- √ PVRG indicated they are developing their training materials at this time. I understand materials have been collated and gathered into a loose leaf binder.
- ✓ TSAR has forwarded copies of their training materials.
- SMRG wrote indicating they were revising their training materials.
- ✓ Nothing has been heard from BRMG and RSAR.

In February I reported I hoped all groups would respond by the ASRC annual meeting in April. I said I was optimistic. I remain optimistic, but increasingly realistic.

Recommendation

I plan to recommend a motion that GTOs be annually warranted/commissioned by the ASRC Board so as to enable the ASRC Training Officer an administrative vehicle to provide the ASRC Board of Directors an opportunity for review of individual GTO participation and timeliness on issues where ASRC GTO input and response is appropriate or needed.

M/SAR Recertification

During a meeting on March 27, 1993, the Pennsylvania Search & Rescue Council (PSARC) approved issuing a Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) to the Appalachian Search & Rescue Conference, Inc. (ASRC) for a period of not less then ninety (90) days to enable the ASRC to use the existing PSARC nationwide license and call sign, WPBM 671, in the following frequencies:

155.160

120 watts maximum output

150,775

2.5 watts maximum output (for mobile vehicular repeater operations)

Note:

150.775 is an input frequency for mobile vehicular retransmitters. Handheld radios transmitting on 150.775 are restricted to 2.5 watts maximum. Mobile units are not allowed to transmit on this frequency beyond 2.5 watts output.

Should you accept this offer, please sign and date one copy of this letter and one copy of the PSARC Communications SOP. Your signature will constitute, for this purpose, an MOA. Signed materials should be returned to the PSARC at the above address.

Standard Operating Procedures

Operational Version R.0.02

1.0 Purpose

Standard Operating Procedures (SOPs) are designed to facilitate the effectiveness and efficiency of Pennsylvania Search and Rescue Council (Council) member programs when they participate in search and rescue (SAR) incidents in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, and adjoining states and regions.

9.0 Communications

9.1 The following are the standard PSARC operational radio frequencies:

155.160 120 watts maximum output 150.775 2.5 watts maximum output (for mobile vehicular repeater operations)

- 9.2 All participating PSARC groups will use a centralized communications net within the unified PSARC command structure operation. Routine communications traffic shall be restricted to official PSARC operations and/or training. Call sign designations shall be used routinely and a written communications log maintained in all operations and training programs. The Communications Log shall be a part of the official records of a PSARC group or PSARC unified command operation. Station identification/call sign designations shall be transmitted at regular 30 minute intervals by the PSARC base station radio operator.
- 9.3 By using the PSARC license and call sign, WPBM 671, PSARC member units agree to abide by all FCC rules and regulations, the conditions of the PSARC license, and be responsible for any fines or forfeitures levied because of improper operation caused by their unit.
- 9.4 The PSARC Communications Committee shall act as the coordinating body for authorizing and assigning radio frequencies, and designating tactical call signs to PSARC groups for the station license(s) held by the PSARC.

When using the PSARC call sign, member units operating a base station shall identify themselves with a three-part identification from the following list. Call signs for mobile and/or individual team shall be a three-part identification from the following list.

Mobile/Field Team Call Signs

(1)	[WPBM 671]	(1)	[WPBM 671]
(2)	[Penn. Search & Rescue Council]	(2)	[one-word PSARC Team Name]
(3)	on a mission/training exercise [County, at hours]	(3)	[Team 1, 2, 3 as appropriate]

The PSARC call sign shall be given by the PSARC base radio operator at times prescribed by FCC Rules and Regulations.

Use of the PSARC license covers only those radios which are owned by PSARC member units. All radio equipment must be FCC Type Accepted for operation in Part 90. The operation of amateur, marine, home-built radios or power amplifiers modified for operation on 155.160 Mhz is not covered by the PSARC license.

The PSARC Communications Committee shall also be the coordinating body for the development and updating of Memorandums of Agreements (MOAs) dealing primarily with communications issues between the PSARC and related emergency service organizations. All MOAs will be approved by the PSARC Board of Directors. The authorization to use the PSARC license and call sign will remain in effect as long as the FCC license is valid and the PSARC member unit remains in good standing.

The following frequencies may be used by SAR resources under Letters of Agreement with the following organizations only for the purposes stated:

Frequency Purpose

Letter of Authorization By/Date

...Reserved for future use...

- 9.5 The secure net direction is: SECURE THE NET. This means an SRU radio operator is about to transmit sensitive information and requests that other system users take precautions in having others not listen to the transmission, and the release of any information from that transmission. Information regarding that transmission should come only from the Incident Commander or designee! This protocol is useful when transmitting Status-2 or Status-3 data in order to protect the family or others, including the media, in the vicinity of radios.
- 9.6 No operational 10 codes will be used in SAR operations except (1) map coordinates; (2) patient status codes; and (3) secure net requests. Patient care should never be restricted to maintain operational code protocols. Patient status codes are:

Status-1 Subject is alive and is able to walk out without assistance.

Status-2 Subject is alive and requires assistance.

Status-3 Subject is deceased.

9.7 Revisions to this Communications SOP will be made periodically by the PSARC Communications Committee to support the PSARC Communications Plan. Recommended revisions shall be approved by the PSARC Board of Directors. Where operationally reasonable, the PSARC Communications SOP may be maintained as a separate document with referencing in this general SOP.

PROPOSED ALERT OFFICER (AO) CERTIFICATION REQUIREMENTS

- 1. Be certified as Incident Staff (IS) or Incident Commander (IC).
- 2. Serve as IS or IC on at least 3 missions (simulations are NOT acceptable). On at least one of these missions, begin serving as IS or IC within 3 hours of the point at which the ASRC first arrives on scene.
- 3. Be trained in Conference Dispatch by a Dispatch Supervisor. Observe and participate in Conference Dispatch for a total of 12 hours. The training may be coincident with observation.
- 4. Complete the AO training course. Pass the written test.
- 5. Demonstrate knowledge, confidence and political competence in a practical examination given by an experienced AO selected by the Alert/Dispatch Coordinator. This examination will include the candidate acting as AO in several simulated Alert scenarios involving varying complexities and complications of political, organizational and technical nature.
- 6. Complete a training course concerning the peculiarities of the area in which the AO will function. Pass the written or oral test.
- 7. Be approved by a simple majority of eligible voters present at a Group business meeting.
- 8. Be approved by a simple majority of eligible voters present at an ASRC Board of Directors meeting.
