I. Welcome and Opening Remarks

The 2014 AGM Meeting of the ASRC was opened with a welcome to all by Don Scelza, Chairman, at 1008 on Sunday, June 1, 2014, in the Kaleidoscope Room of Newcomb Hall at the University of Virginia, Charlottesville, VA. Chair Scelza announced that he was honored to be a part of the organization, pleased with the 40|40 Conference and pleased with the progress being made by the organization.

Chair Scelza introduced the ASRC Board Officers in attendance.

Attendees present and proxies declared by each group were counted (84). (Based upon 2014 Group Rosters in possession of the Secretary and Article XI, D of the Articles of Incorporation, members present and proxies must equal or exceed one third of the membership to make a quorum = 106.666). Chair requested teams do a better job of securing proxies prior to the meeting when members cannot attend. Weiss noted that per Roberts Rules of Order, continuation of the meeting is acceptable in the absence of a quorum, if a quorum call is not initiated.

II. Chairman's Report

A. Vision and Goals

Chair Scelza indicated he will write down and share the ASRC vision and goals he announced during the May 31, 2014, 40|40 Conference dinner key note address.

During the 2013 AGM, there was an open discussion regarding how the ASRC can better support each Group. The Chair provided an update regarding each item documented during the 2013 AGM, and will continue to relay progress on each at future meetings:

1. Groups are juggling multiple certifications – can the ASRC help to promote ASRC standards as acceptable to state specific authorities?

Chair and the new Conference Training Officer will work with Groups to promote the acceptance of ASRC certifications.

Update: Progress is being made. The PA SAR Coordinator shared during the 40|40 Conference state specific advances. Other teams from the ASRC can join PASARCO. The FTM standards of the ASRC are accepted in PA. The issue in VA remains the administrative process and paperwork. Maryland can request assistance from other ASRC teams (until NRP is involved). VA teams can request assistance from other ASRC teams. Groups will be the driving forces in each state. Certified ASRC Search Manager response capabilities should not be limited, regardless of whether they respond as a specific group member or general conference resource. Conference needs to work on certification acceptance administratively, but any changes will not impact the conference operationally.

Chair strongly encouraged team leaders to engage membership to become involved in remote support. Encouraging more commitment and participation in

this area is not only beneficial for each Group, but also the Conference as a whole.

Chair recommended that Groups continue local outreach and encouraged coordination of joint trainings with local authorities.

2. Reciprocity among states – can ASRC help?

Training standards are generally accepted, but the certification method is not. Cross-certification among teams will require work across the conference of both training and operations.

Update: Progress being made. Driving PTB's that are in development to meet ASTM standards. Chair and CTO working on a more detailed schedule for completion of the PTB/certification project.

Member noted that certification policy is more essential than the PTB's themselves. It is possible that a preamble to the PTB documentation will be necessary in VA, documenting Board governance over the certification process.

3. How many people would like standard ASRC written tests?

General agreement by attendees. Could create a question bank and pool vetted bank for all teams to use (possibly extended to practical testing). Scope of actual testing and certification requires future discussion: how to certify, cadre of certifiers/evaluators, how evaluators will be chosen – then develop standard testing. Create new document devoted to certification versus including in Administrative Manual.

Update: Progress being made. Officers putting a plan in place to document more detailed schedule for completion.

4. Request for Groups to notify all other Groups when they host speakers.

Possibly the conference could sponsor speakers to present topics to the conference. Joint training opportunities are desired – integrate classroom and practical exercise.

Update: The 40|40 Conference was a start to provide speakers and informational briefings. Request made for groups to post training details on their Group Google calendars, so will automatically cross-post to the (combined) calendar present on asrc.net.

B. Operations Manual

Some progress made. Hope to have draft out soon for review.

C. 40|40 Conference

Chair thanked the founding members for participating in the Conference/AGM weekend. All founders added a great deal to the conference and it was invaluable that they were able to provide continuity across the years.

Chair asked Secretary to post on the ASRC Facebook page:

The ASRC held the 40|40 Conference on May 31, 2014, in Charlottesville, VA, and founders Keith Conover, Gene Harrison and Ray Cole were able to attend. We endeavor to sustain the spirit they infused into the organization.

Chair reported that no ASRC funds were utilized for the conference – BRMRG covered most of the cost with financial support also provided by SMRG. Chair reported that two anonymous donors provided the ASRC challenge coins (\$1,218.00) and the ASRC lapel pins (\$918.00).
