Training and recruitment

We used it on a recent vertical practice. It is very fast and easy to apply, very secure, flexible enough to deal with all sorts of different injuries, and much more comfortable than standard tieins or straps.

We are now looking for a new litter; a split plastic Ferno would be ideal. Does any group have information on splitting a plastic Ferno?
